Graduates enjoy quality jobs, more money, better health outcomes, less likely to smoke, more likely to exercise, and less prone to depression.




#### Is it worth it?

# Average annual salary of graduates and non-graduates in England from 2007 to 2021 (in 1,000 GBP)




Graduates Postgraduates Non-graduates



#### **Key dates in the UCAS cycle**

- 30 April 2024: UCAS search tool will display 2025 courses.
- 14 May 2024: UCAS undergraduate application for 2025 cycle opens.
- **3 September 2024**: Completed 2025 entry UCAS Undergraduate applications can be submitted to UCAS.
- 15 October 2024 (18:00 UK time): 2025 entry deadline for the universities of Oxford and Cambridge, and most courses in medicine, veterinary medicine/science and dentistry.
- 22 November 2024: Kingston College internal deadline for completed applications.
- 29 January 2025 (18:00 UK time): Equal consideration deadline for all 2025 UCAS Undergraduate applications.

- All applications are online via UCAS portal – Buzzword: kingstoncollege25
- Students initially have up to 5 choices
- Cost £28.50
- USE EVERY CHOICE WISELY

#### Personal Statement



- Chance to "sell" yourself to an Admissions Tutor
- No more than 47 lines or 4000 characters (incl. spaces)
- One personal statement for all choices
- Suggested model of 5 key paragraphs
  - 1. The course
  - 2. Experience/voluntary work related to chosen field
  - 3. Interests & achievements
  - 4. What you hope to gain from university
  - 5. Conclusion
- Plenty of personal statement support and examples online – beware of plagiarism!



#### **Student Finance**

- Tuition fees held at maximum of £9,250
- Applications for Student Finance will open **early March 2025** students should submit them by late May 2025
- Student Finance comprises of Tuition Fee Loan and a Maintenance Loan
- Repayments at 9% above threshold of £25,000pa with a repayment period of 40 years.
- Interest rate on loan RPI + 3%
  - Repayments are **based on your income**, not what you borrowed!
- Eligibility requirements please clarify with Student Finance England. Generally, applicants will have settled status and **3 years** continuous residency within the UK.
- Universities offer scholarships and bursaries

# **Higher Education Explained**

HNC – (Level 4)

This qualification prepares you for work in a specific area, usually over a year. You can move from a Higher National Certificate (HNC) to a Higher National Diploma (HND) or a Foundation Degree (FdA). Some universities will accept you straight on to the second year of an Honours Degree.

HND – (Level 5)

This is a work-related qualification in itself. You convert it over one or two years from an HNC. Alternatively the HND is a stepping- stone to a degree course.

Foundation Degree

This course is equivalent to the first two years (Levels 4 and 5) of an Honours Degree. You can study a variety of work-related subjects, full time or part time, to fit around your work or other commitments. The option of taking an extra year to 'top up' to a full Honours Degree is also yours.

Honours Degree

We offer our Bachelor of Arts (BA Hons) and Bachelor of Science (BSc Hons) degrees in conjunction with our partner universities - Kingston, Canterbury Christ Church, Middlesex and Roehampton.
